You have to decide your comfort level and what you are willing to do. This is a list of ideas. It is not exhaustive and I hope you add to it. – Rev Laura

- 1. Take a piece of chalk or two and write a message of love and hope others can see.
- 2. Attend the Community Success Summit on Tues, Nov 15. Visit this site for more details: <a href="http://www.irisncw.org/">http://www.irisncw.org/</a>
- Attend the support rally for Standing Rock and protest the North Dakota Pipeline, Tues, Nov 15 at 3:30pm at the former Hastings parking lot at 9<sup>th</sup> St and Chelan/Mission.
- 4. Sign up to attend the Café Scholarship Dinner on Fri, Dec 9 or fund a scholarship (http://www.nwfamilyservices.net/cafe.html)
- 5. Take a safety pin and information sheet to indicate you are a safe person.
- 6. Help serve and eat with the people who are homeless on Thanksgiving Day at the Powerhouse Ministry shelter. Call church for more info.
- 7. Write a letter to a group of Muslim women in Nebraska that are scared. (See Rev Laura for more information)
- 8. Get a pack of post it notes and leave messages of love and hope in different public places.
- 9. Help with the Saturday meal at St Luke's Episcopal Church that feeds people in poverty. (Ask Rev Laura for more information)
- 10. Volunteer at Lee Elementary school at 15th and Baker or at any school.
- 11. Participate in a Spanish/English Bilingual class (Let Rev Laura know if interested)
- 12. Attend Diversity Council Meetings/City Council Meetings/School Board Meetings Or even run for a local office.
- 13. Practice random acts of kindness.
- 14. Sit down and have a conversation with someone who you do not know or do not agree with. Try to understand and be learn the deeper story of why they believe what they do.
- 15. Buy as many as you can Plan B pills (over the counter contraception) and donate them to local shelters.
- 16. Attend a Spectrum LGBTQ Support Group on the Third Tues (Nov 15) at 6:30pm at CUUF or the Spectrum Game Day on Sat, Nov 19 at 2pm at CUUF.
- 17. Take a class on anti-racism, anti-oppression.
- 18. Write a letter to the Safety Valve in the Wenatchee World or respond to one that is promoting hate.
- 19. Volunteer at the Literacy Council and help with English as a Second Language classes or Citizenship classes.
- 20. Let people know you care and you are willing to be a support. Don't question their experience, just listen, and walk alongside.
